It should include name(s) of author(s), institutional affiliation, mailing address, email address and mobile telephone number of each corresponding author; including key objective(s), regional location of study and key findings. The abstract which should portray originality and include not more than 6 key words should be sent via e-mail to fudjer@fudutsinma.edu.ng.

Full Paper: Each article should be accompanied by an abstract and should be between 3,500 and 6,000 words (14 printed pages), including title, author(s) information, full name(s), institution, address, phone and e-mail address of the corresponding author, tables, figures and references in APA format.

Text: Should be type –written on one side of A4 size papers with 2.54cm margins all around and should be in 1.5 line spacing
